

## ENHANCED INDEX

This index was generated from a list of words and terms manually selected from the text by the author. This list of search terms was then passed into a computer program that searched the text (including tables and Bibliography references) to produce the page numbers on which those terms can be found. The result was then manually edited by the author. This index is thus more detailed and contains more abbreviation entries (such as ACEI) than the **Index of General Terms** in the book but has less hierarchical structure to it. This means there are no sub-entries so ‘avascular villi’ is found directly at ‘avascular’ and not under ‘placenta’ → ‘villi’ → ‘avascular’. Thus, in the book, you can browse the sub-entries under ‘Drugs & toxins’ or ‘Syndromes’ but in this enhanced index those sub-entries are now full entries scattered throughout in alphabetical order.

Some molecules and chemicals are included here which are not present in the manually prepared **Index of Molecules** in the book (such as aurinitricarboxylic acid) because these are more relevant to histotechnology, pharmacology or toxicology rather than molecular diagnostics. However, the converse is also true so the Index of Molecules is not redundant. Some eponyms are also included here but you should also see the **Index of Eponyms** found in the book which is more complete in this regard.

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
